Data indicates that within one year of graduation, 91 percent of Presbyterian seminary alumni are serving in their professional callings. There’s an urgent need for these seminarian graduates as we anticipate approximately 85 percent of currently active clergy in PC(USA) congregations to retire over the coming decade. It is our goal through the Theological Education Fund to fully support their commitment to ecclesiastical service.
